Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will be able to identify and rectify threats to the Earth.• Students will adopt a small plant, name it, and take responsibility for its care, reinforcing the importance of plants in our ecosystem.• To relate human behavior to environmental impact on Earth.• To help students understand the importance of recycling and protecting the Earth through a fun hands-on project.
Participants	Grade 1&2 students.
Activity	<p>Grade 1: Grade 1 students took part in two engaging activities to build environmental awareness. In a drawing activity on "Environmental Impact on Earth," they illustrated scenes of clean and polluted areas, tree planting, and deforestation, showing how human actions affect the planet.</p> <p>They also joined a hands-on "Recycling and Art from Waste" activity, using old newspapers, plastic bottles, and boxes to create pencil holders, paper flowers, and decorative items—learning the value of recycling and creativity.</p> <p>Grade 2: Grade 2 students participated in "Adopt a Plant – Make a Plant Passport." Each child brought a plant and created a passport with its name, care tips, and fun facts. They also expressed their thoughts about Earth through drawings and writing. This activity fostered responsibility, creativity, and care for the environment.</p>
