BRIEF REPORT

The first day of the academic year 2026 at Wise Indian School were commenced from 20th April onwards, marking an enthusiastic and engaging start for students across Grades 3 to 10. It was marked by a series of engaging and meaningful activities across Grades 3 to 10, aimed at fostering confidence, collaboration, and goal setting among students.

Grade 3 students participated in an interactive “Greetings” circle, where they introduced themselves in French using simple phrases and passed a soft ball to encourage participation, followed by a fun command-based activity, “Jacques dit,” which enhanced their listening skills and understanding of instructions. Students of Grades 4 and 5 focused on the theme “My Best Year Yet – 2026,” with Grade 5 learners creating a “Goal Wheel” to reflect on their personal and academic aspirations. Grade 6 students collaboratively designed an “Awareness Tree,” expressing their understanding of current global and social issues through creative contributions.

Grade 7 students engaged in a reflective “Time Capsule Letter” activity, writing to their future selves about their goals, dreams, and expectations, which were sealed to be revisited at the end of the year. In Grade 8, the “All About Me Bingo” activity encouraged peer interaction and helped students learn more about each other in an enjoyable way.

Grade 9 students contributed to a collective “One Class One Vision” display by creating hand-shaped cutouts representing their individual goals, symbolizing unity and shared purpose. Meanwhile, Grade 10 students collaborated in groups to create a “Half-Cup Garden of Goals,” visually representing their aspirations through a creative and symbolic display. Overall, the activities successfully created a positive and welcoming environment, promoting self-expression, teamwork, and a strong sense of purpose for the year ahead.
